Howard has been involved in the design and administration of wraparound systems of care for children and adults, as well as acting as a wraparound service coordinator. Currently he is consultant to several Coordinated Service Team counties in Wisconsin and provides training in his specialty areas for the Wisconsin child welfare training partnerships. Tom Schleitwiler

Tom has dedicated his career to the Human Services field. He has recently retired after working for Jefferson County Human Services Department for nearly 32 years, 22 of which he served as Human Services Director. During his time at Jefferson County Tom focused on optimizing agency structure and teamwork, integrating services, building evidenced based programs throughout, and building community-wide collaborative systems.
