CANS discussion with Tim Connors (Conference call)	Tim gave background and rationale for comprehensive CANS. DCF systematic approach to assess needs for out of home placement. 6 levels of care for placement based on an algorithm. MH CANS has 47 items, comprehensive has 150 items. Discussion on pros and cons of CST moving to comprehensive version. Pro's-common ground with child welfare, if issues exist, we know them, on line training, common language. Con's-SACWIS not available to tribes, may be too long and involved for voluntary families, does CST really need all that? Seems more interest in deficient's than strengths. Is there any chance that CST's could choose which version would work best for the process in their community?
