
JESSIE BENASH

Jessie Benash, LCSW, is an outpatient child therapist, an adjunct professor at UW-Whitewater and a motivational speaker. She served on the executive board of YES! (Youth Emotional Stability) in Rock County and co-wrote a grant for the first annual suicide awareness and prevention event for Rock County. Jessie has been involved in Wisconsin's Trauma-Informed Care movement for almost ten years and is involved with the Wisconsin School Mental Health Initiative. Jessie shares her story so others can see that no matter what happens, there is always hope. She was an outgoing 15 year old cheerleader when she was in a motorcycle accident that left her disabled and angry. She struggled to finish high school, but she beat the odds and eventually became a licensed clinical social worker. When she was 34 years old, her leg was amputated and she faced new struggles. Instead of giving up, she continues to live her life every day, going to work and being a mother and wife. She got to where she is because people didn't give up on her, and she didn't give up on herself.



DARRIN L. HARRIS

Darrin L. Harris, a native of New Orleans, is the Chief Executive Officer of Ekhaya Leadership Institute. After a life-changing visit to Africa in 2007, he began Ekhaya Youth Project, Inc. - a nonprofit that supports youth and their families. In 2014, Mr. Harris expanded the mental health component of the organization by providing clinical support services through the Ekhaya Fresh Start Behavioral Health Program. Darrin has been on the front line of social reforms - getting aid to young people who've aged out of foster care, helping those who live with debilitating illnesses, caring for the homeless, assisting the disenfranchised and marginalized in our society, and supporting youth living with mental or behavioral challenges.
